2023 was a very productive year for our Academy. We organized a successful annual conference in San Diego, California, USA, on October 4th-7th, 2023, about Testing and Performance: Laboratory and Clinical Challenges. The positive outcome of the Meeting was guaranteed by the nine outstanding keynote lecturers, six Lunch & Learn speakers, two Meetthe-Industry sessions, and Marshalls Award finalists' presentations. With more than 300 attendees and 190 posters, we could replicate the numbers we were used to before the pandemic. The joint Meeting with the American Academy of Cariology (AAC) in the same venue the day before our conference with speakers from both the AAC and ADM focusing on the biological interactions of materials with the oral tissues and novel formulations to enhance the longevity of restorations was an enriching experience of exchange of expertise much appreciated by those

who attended the Meeting. I'd like to thank the 2023 AAC President, Sandra Guzman-Armstrong, for sharing this opportunity with us and the ADM speakers who contributed to the scientific program.

In 2023 and over the past months, the ADM Board has worked at different levels. We have focused our efforts on revising the by-laws

regarding the fellowship criteria. The first proposal was presented during the Business Meeting in San Diego. Still, the Membership did not approve it, and we are currently working on a new proposal.

As announced in San Diego, we have started the selection process for the new Editor-in-Chief (EIC) of Dental Materials, our official Journal. The call for the EIC position was made at the end of January, and the selection results will be announced during the upcoming annual conference.

A call for nominations will also open soon for the Board Members-at-Large positions that will become vacant at the end of this year. ADM candidates will be selected by the Board based on their potential contributions to the Board in its mission and promotion of the Academy among members and externally. Elections will be held electronically at least thirty days before the annual Business meeting.

The Membership and Outreach Chair, Dr. Alex Fok, ran the first survey about the level of satisfaction of our ADM members (results are reported further in the newsletter), which gave us an essential insight into the strengths and weaknesses of the Academy. Some exciting proposals for new initiatives derived from members' suggestions were made by the Outreach Committee, and the Board intends to carry them out.

Time flies really quickly, and it is already time to announce the upcoming annual conference that will be held in the magnificent Torino in Italy on October 2nd-5th, 2024. The longevity of dental materials, Biomaterials applications, and AI and innovative technologies are the main topics of the Meeting, entitled "Exploring the current and future trends in dental Materials." Lorenzo Breschi, Alessandro Vichi, Reinhard Hickel, Mary Ann Melo, Josette Camilleri, Marco Bottino, Jerome Chevalier, Anne Géraldine Guex, and Sara Marceglia are the distinguished lecturers who will animate the scientific sessions. The Lunch & Learn session will feature Vinicius Rosa, Vesna Miletic, Hilde Molvig Kopperud, Salvatore Sauro, Jukka Matinlinna, and Ana Carina Bedran-Russo. We are also organizing memorable social events to enrich your journey to Italy. I would like to encourage all our members not to miss the chance to participate and visit Italy!

Annual Meeting 2024

After navigating through a challenging pandemic, ADM successfully organized its second in-person Annual Meeting in San Diego, USA, from October 4 to 7th. In addition, ADM actively contributed to and supported the American Academy of Cariology (AAC) meeting, held at the same venue on October 4. The AAC Meeting centered on current evidence and research concerning minimally invasive caries management and strategies to enhance dental materials and their interactions with the host. This Meeting served as a vital bridge between clinical practice and dental materials research and development, and we received positive feedback from our members, with 25 ADM representatives in attendance.

ADM substantially contributed to the meeting program with four distinguished ADM speakers -Dr. Jack Ferracane, Dr. Andrei Ionescu, Dr. Roberto Braga, and Dr. Marco Bottino-addressing biofilm management strategies,

various restorative materials, therapeutic effects, and regenerative technologies for pulp management. Following this intensive schedule, discussions continued at a joint reception held by ADM and AAC.


The ADM meeting program featured nine worldclass speakers focusing on "Material Testing and Performance." The global interest in ADM continues to grow, with 317 participants from 32 different countries attending the event in San Diego.



The first day of the ADM meeting emphasized adverse reactions to medical devices and dental cosmetics, including presentations by Dr. Albert Feilzer and Dr. Thomas Rustmeyer. After the poster session, the first-day program continued with short presentations of three Marshall Post-doctoral award finalists. Dr Lars Björman presented his experiences with the Norwegian Dental Biomaterials Adverse Reaction Unit. This focused session sparked thoughtful discussions,

especially regarding the immunological response to dental materials.

The second day commenced with a meet-the-industry session from Shofu-Inc. featuring Prof. Noriko Hiraishi's insights on Giomer/S-PRG fillers and their impact on minimally invasive dentistry. Subsequently, the focus shifted to wear in the oral environment, with presentations by Dr. Pekka Vallittu and Garry Fleming on masticatory function wear testing methods and continued after the poster session with the presentation of Dr. Nicola Scotti on the clinical wear of dental materials.



The final day of the Meeting began with another meet-the-industry session offered by Dentsply, with Prof. Mark Latta talking about reproducible modeling for adhesive testing after salivary contamination, followed by updates on CAD-CAM materials. Dr. Paulo Cesar provided an overview of zirconia evaluation, Dr. Ulrich Lohbauer delved into the complex glass science

behind lithium disilicates, and Satoshi Yamaguchi presented an overview of CAD-CAM hybrid materials.

This exciting program was completed with three Marshall Award finalists' presentations, six Lunch and learn sessions, and poster presentations that further enriched the program, offering attendees insights into the latest developments in dental materials research. The social dinner at a beautiful rooftop venue overlooking San Diego provided a delightful networking opportunity, complemented by delicious cuisine and lively karaoke sessions.





Our heartfelt thanks go to our President, Board members, moderators, and sponsors for their outstanding contributions and support. We eagerly anticipate reconnecting in Torino in 2024.

Treasurer's Report By Carmem Pfeifer

- 1. Financially, the Academy is still in good shape. The net assets have increased by \$16,296 to date (from \$913,518 to \$929,814 in 2023). The total assets line reflects the values as of December 31 each year (calendar year totals). All expenses have been matched against the assets, which only happens after the annual Meeting.
- The current assets in each bank account are as follows (as of January 15, 2024): Wells Fargo Savings: \$389,617; Wells Fargo Checking: \$66,619; Brokerage: \$473,578; Total: \$929,814.
- 3. The final accounting for the 2023 annual meeting held in San Diego was: Income: \$209,920 (sponsorship: \$99,480; registration: \$94,090; Expenses: \$199,840, resulting in a surplus of \$10,080. The total number of registrations was 303, with 248 paid attendees. Our joint Meeting with the American Academy of Cariology yielded 7 extra participants in our Meeting.
- 4. Progress of the FAC activities: the investment in the fixed-income brokerage account on Wells Fargo has produced \$23,578 in dividends so far. The current interest rate we are accruing is 3.5% APR.

We are investigating other options for when this account reaches maturity in 2025.

5. This was the third year of the Bowen Early Career Investigator Award, for a total of \$20,000 in sponsorship. Applications were reviewed by 2-3 reviewers each. We had several worthy applicants, two of whom were extremely close in score. Since we have had a surplus from the 2022 budget, we have awarded two grants in 2023.

From the Editorial Office By David Watts and Nick Silikas

During and since the pandemic and lockdown, there has been a downward trend in the number of submitted and accepted manuscripts. This appears in line with other journals and contrasts with the increase in requests to submit review manuscripts, many on very unsuitable topics. However, some truly excellent and highly cited

reviews have been published. In 2023, more than 800 submissions have been received. We continue to prioritize original (experimental) research papers over review papers. The rejection rate is currently *ca.* 75 %. The largest number of submissions are coming from Asia, followed by Europe and South America. Germany appears to lead the countries in terms of quality. An additional Editorial Board member from China has been appointed.

Most papers are published on a *Subscription basis* – without publication charge. They are freely available to subscribers (particularly ADM Members) as well as developing countries and patient groups through Elsevier access programs. From 2019 through 2022/3, an increasing proportion of articles (42 in 2022) have been published in the "Gold Open Access" (GOA), which results in significant fees to the ADM. NB, there is a "firewall" that blocks the Editorial Team in a more 'compact' format. This means that the weight (mass) of print copies is reduced, which aligns with Elsevier's environmental and sustainability goals.

The 2022 Impact Factor was 5.0, slightly reduced from 2021, with *Dental Materials* in 5th place out of 91 journals. CiteScore Tracker, based on the past 4 years, for 2023 was 9.8 (updated monthly). In total, 215 abstracts were submitted. 2 abstracts were rejected, and 23 were either withdrawn or not registered. As a result, we had 190 abstracts

accepted (180 regular abstracts, 7 Paffenbarger Award abstracts, and 3 Marshalls Award abstracts).
