## Annual Meeting - 2024

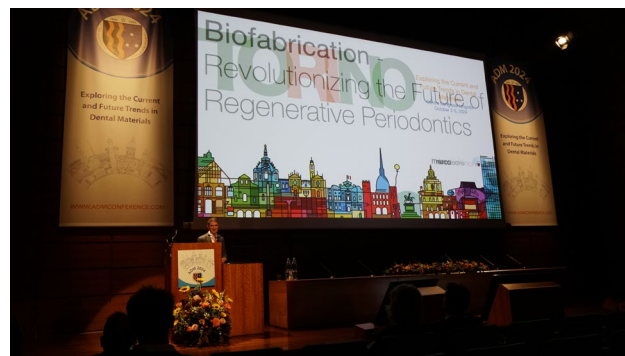
In 2024, ADM held the annual meeting in *bella Torino, Italia* from September 28 through October 1. The attendee list totaled 426 participants, from 40 different countries.



The morning sessions on the first day of the meeting focused on adhesives and resin composites starting with an excellent presentation by Dr. Lorenzo Breschi from the University of Bologna, followed by Dr. Alessandro Vichi (University of Portsmouth). After the poster session in the Nizza Gallery of the Lingotto, the program continued with short, yet high quality presentations of three Marshall Postdoctoral award finalists. First day closed with Dr Reinhard Hickel's presentation on the updated FDI criteria for evaluation of restorations. The afternoon had exciting lunch and learn tables, led by Drs. Vinicius Rosa, Vesna Miletic, Hilde Molvig Kopperud, Salvatore Sauro, Jukka Matinlinna and Ana Bedran-Russo.

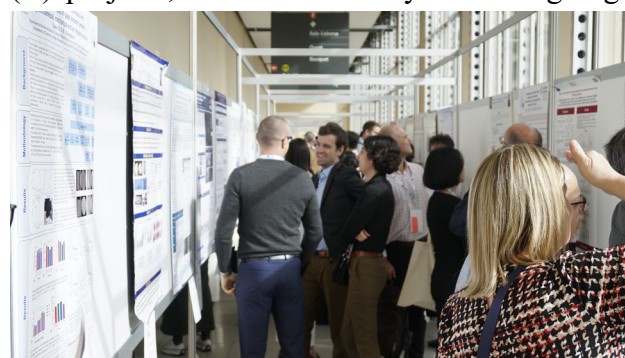
The second day of the meeting kicked off with the meet-the industry session. Prof Masano Inokoshi presented on the "Current status and future prospects of S-PRG filler-containing dental materials in geriatric dentistry". The regular programming of the second day started with Dr. Mary Anne Melo, from the University

of Maryland, speaking about antimicrobial materials. A lively discussion ensued. Then, Dr. Josette Camilleri, from the University of Birmingham, presented updates on Endodontic materials. After the poster session, Dr. Marco Bottino, from the University of Michigan, gave a thought-provoking talk on Biofabrication applied to regenerative periodontics.



On the third day, the presenters focused on artificial intelligence and cutting-edge technologies. Dr. Jerome Chevalier, from INSA in Lyon, talked about metallic glasses for dental applications, followed by a presentation by Dr. Anne Geraldine Guex, from the University of Basel, on in vitro model systems to model the interfaces of dental implants. After the poster session, the last presentation of the day was by Dr. Sara Marcegaglia, from the University of Trieste. She talked about artificial intelligence in the development of materials. The talk was very interesting and resulted in a great discussion afterwards.

The poster sessions combined a whopping 294 (!!) projects, in a wide variety of cutting-edge



topics. The networking opportunities during poster session are always a highlight of the meeting, and we had a great turnout.

The social dinner was hosted at the Automobile Museum in Torino, a few blocks from the Lingotto. The “automobile” theme permeated the whole meeting, and the social dinner could not be different! The entertainment during the evening was excellent, and the tradition of a karaoke is taking hold in the ADM!



A special treat for our delegation: the museum was hosting an exhibit about the three-times Formula One champion Ayrton Senna, a national hero in Brazil.



We thank our president Milena Cadenaro, and the local organizer, Nicola Scotti. Not only was the scientific content terrific, but the food, the entertainment and the location were outstanding.

**Italians DO do it better!** We also thank our sponsors for the continued support to our meetings and we look forward to meeting all together again in Panama, later this year (2025).

## Treasurer's Report

Financially, the Academy is still in good shape. The net assets have increased by \$66,549 to date (from \$929,814 in Dec 2023 to \$996,363 as of Sep 20, 2024). The total assets line reflects the values as of December 31 each year (calendar year totals), after all expenses have been matched against the assets, which only happens after the annual meeting.

The current assets in each bank account are as follows (as of Sep 20, 2024): Wells Fargo

Savings: \$470,112; Wells Fargo Checking: \$202,046; Brokerage: \$483,746; Total: \$1,155,904. After all the 2024 meeting accounting was finalized, the current assets stand at \$996,363.

The final accounting for the 2024 annual meeting held in Torino was: Income: \$242,893 (sponsorship: \$83,095; registration \$159,798); Expenses: \$166,782, resulting in a surplus of \$93,586. The total number of registrations was 439.

The investment in the fixed income brokerage account on Wells Fargo has produced \$10,160 in dividends so far in 2024. The current interest rate we are accruing is 3.5% APR. We are investigating other options for when this account reaches maturity in 2025. As it is, these dividends do not cover the whole cost of the Bowen award, so this is being subsidized by the ADM.

This was the third year of the Bowen early career investigator award, for a total of \$20,000 in sponsorship. Applications were reviewed by 2-3 reviewers each. We had several worthy applicants, two of which were extremely close in score. Since we have had surplus from the 2022 budget, we have awarded two grants in 2023. The total awards given in 2023 have increased substantially – one of the Bowen awardees (from 2022) asked for an extension, so the expenses for 3 awards were included in the budget for 2023 (totaling \$60,000).

The dinner in Torino was partially subsidized by the ADM. This has been the case for the past several meetings.

## From the Editorial Office

### Editor's report

This is my concluding report as EIC to the ADM Board. It has been a great privilege to serve the

ADM as EIC for many years. From the outset I have been ably assisted by **Diana Knight** as *Editorial Assistant*. For several years, **Ron Sakaguchi** was *Associate Editor*. Subsequently **Nick Silikas** has been a most outstanding *Editorial Advisor* and, more recently, *Editor*. I am grateful to all the ADM Presidents, under whom I have served, to the ADM Board and the DM Editorial Board and the many reviewers. Profound thanks to you all.

Going forward, from January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025, the journal will be in the very capable hands of the new EIC: my esteemed friend Dr **Jack Ferracane**. We have known each other since the early 1980s. I thank Ric and Milena for expediting the EIC selection process. Jack and I have already had discussions on the transitional process over the remaining months of 2024. I will continue to offer help, upon request, during early 2025. Jack is already acquainted with our Senior Publisher at Elsevier, **Lindsay Allen**. It is a separate matter, but the time is drawing near for a major contract renewal with Elsevier.

One important aspect is the page budget. In the contract, there is an agreed page budget of **1400** print pages and **300** additional online-only pages. However, the following data show a *list of pages* published during the term (prior to this year):

2023: 1201 in print and e-only  
 2022: 2114 in print and 317 e-only  
 2021: 1884 in print and 532 e-only  
 2020: 1690 in print and 402 e-only

In 2024 we have published 1707 print pages to the end of October, which suggests a final total of 2276 pages. Lindsay is comfortable with us having exceeded the page budget, as Elsevier is enthusiastic about growth. *Dental Materials* is a hybrid journal and there has been a significant rise in the proportion of Gold Open Access (GOA) articles published *versus* Subscription articles. The figures (to date) for 2024 are 56 GOA vs. 87 Subscription. NB The journal editor(s) are not made aware of each author's



publication preference. Therefore, we cannot prioritise GOA papers for publication.

The geographical pattern of articles has remained similar over the past 5 years. The pattern for *submitted* articles is: Asia > Europe > South America > N & Central America. For *accepted* articles, the sequence is: Europe > Asia > N & Central America > South America. The top 5 nations, by *acceptance numbers* are: Brazil > Germany > China > USA > UK.

In the reviewing process, it is sometimes very difficult to obtain reviewers for the more complex research subjects, despite there being “ORCID credits” for undertaking reviews.

**Ranking Trends:** This year there was a slight drop in our *Impact Factor* to 4.6 (from 5.0). However, most other journals suffered IF drops. In particular, the IF for JDR decreased by 25 %. Our publishers suggest that these generalised drops are due to changes in the stage when papers are deemed to be ‘published’.

Our *CiteScore* tracker for 2024 is 8.5 (as of September 5<sup>th</sup>). We are on track to match or exceed our *CiteScore* for 2023 (which was 9.8).

Many Editors and Publishers report a global reduction in submitted research articles, at least for ‘traditional’ journals. This may be due to the growth of (pay for publication) Open Access journals, including ‘paper mills’. There may also be residual social effects of the Covid pandemic.

**Full Text Usage (via Science Direct):** continues at a high level: 720,909 for 2023 and 550,113 (up to September 2024). Top downloaded review articles include: Stansbury on 3D printing (1,256 from 2015) and Jandt on Nanotechnology (114, from 2020).

Top countries for *SD* usage are: China > US > Turkey > Brazil > UK > Korea > Japan > India.

In total there were 336 abstracts submitted. From those 2 abstracts were rejected, there was 1 duplicate and 4 were withdrawn. Therefore, 329 were provisionally accepted.

Subsequently, 31 were either withdrawn or not registered. As a result, we have:

**294 abstracts** accepted and the breakdown is [96+96+88 = 280 regular + 11 Paffenbarger + 3 Marshall]. Overall, there are abstracts presented from 38 countries.

### News from the Board
